### WELCOME TO LOWER NAZARETH TOWNSHIP

Lower Nazareth Township is a great place to live, work, and play. Gently nestled in rich Eastern Pennsylvania farmland, it was originally part of the "Walking Purchase" of 1737. Purchased from William Penn, this area was originally known as "The Drylands". This 83 hundred-acre section was once thought to be doomed and was termed, "Barren". There was very little forest land as the Indians had burned all of the vegetation to drive the game into the open to hunt. This "Barren" appearance of the area gave rise to the popular superstition that no crops could be grown in this region as it was too "dry". Early residents held a rich religious heritage and named Lower Nazareth Township after the biblical town of Nazareth. In 1740 it was written, "The surface of the township is level; the soil limestone, and well improved by judicious course of crops, and careful culture, and very productive". In 1807, Lower Nazareth was created.

Lower Nazareth has experienced slow, controlled growth and established itself as a community of the 21st Century.

### **About Lower Nazareth Township's Government**

Lower Nazareth Township was incorporated in 1807. The Township is defined as a Second Class Township, governed by a Board of five elected Supervisors in accordance with the Pennsylvania Second Class Township Code, enacted in 1933. Townships governed by elected Boards of Supervisors are the most common form of municipal government in Pennsylvania. Townships were the original governmental subdivisions of counties in Pennsylvania.

Local governing bodies like Lower Nazareth Township may only function within the frame work established by the state legislature.

Townships provide important community services which are generally unsuited to private enterprise. Lower Nazareth Township maintains local roads and has the ultimate responsibility for public safety, including police, firefighting, and emergency management. Township programs and services include recreation, zoning and building code regulations and land use planning.

The Board of Supervisors plays the central role in township government. The Board serves as the legislative body of the township, setting policy, enacting ordinances and resolutions, adopting budgets, and levying taxes. Other functions such as formulating the budget, enforcing ordinances, approving expenditures, and personnel matters are delegated by the Board of Supervisors to the Township Manager.

The Board of Supervisors also performs activities such as forming boards and commissions, processing subdivisions and land development applications in accordance with the Pennsylvania Municipalities Planning Code, Lower Nazareth Township

Subdivision and Land Development Ordinance, and Lower Nazareth Township Zoning Ordinance.

The only two (2) mandatory township appointed offices per the Second Class Code are the Secretary and the Treasurer. The Secretary and Treasurer may be appointed from the members of the Board of Supervisors, may be an outside individual or, in the case of treasurer, may be a financial institution. Other appointed positions, other than administrative positions, include the township solicitor and township engineer. The solicitor provides oversight of the legal matters of the township including bonds, real estate transactions, review and preparation of ordinances and actions in court. The Township Engineer reviews and provides comments on subdivision and land development projects before the Board of Supervisors. In addition, the Engineer is involved with the preparation of plans and specifications for Township public works programs including transportation, parks & recreation, and physical plant projects.

### What is the Board of Supervisors?

Lower Nazareth Township is governed by an elected body organized under the Second Class Township Code of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. That Board is called the Board of Supervisors and consists of five (5) elected officials, each serving a six (6) year term.

The Board of Supervisors is charged with the general governance of the township to secure the health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of the Community. To accomplish that task, the Board adopts laws, known as ordinances, which govern various activities within the Township.

The Board may appoint a Township Manager who is charged by the Board with implementing the ordinances it passes and managing the annual budget of the Township, which is adopted by the Board each December for the following calendar year.

### **How Board of Supervisor Meetings Work**

The Board of Supervisors typically meets on a twice monthly basis to conduct business on behalf of the Township. All meetings of the Board are open to the public with an opportunity at each meeting for public comment.

If a resident has a concern he or she feels needs to be addressed by the Township, the individual is encouraged to contact the Township Office. Many times, issues can be addressed by Township Staff. However, if an appearance before the Board is necessary, time may be scheduled to present concerns to the Board of Supervisors. Residents are encouraged to present their views on Township matters in any of the means available, including written or electronic communication or by telephone. The Township Staff strive to facilitate your communication with Board of Supervisors.

### **BOARD OF AUDITORS**

Typically, the Board of Auditors conducts the annual audit of township finances, except when an independent auditor has been appointed by the Board of Supervisors, which is the case in Lower Nazareth Township. The Elected Board of Auditors also set the compensation of supervisors when employed by the township as road masters, road superintendents, road laborers, or as secretary or treasurer.

This Commission is a five-member advisory body to the Board of Supervisors. Each member serves a six-year term. The Planning Commission meets on the third Monday of each month. This Commission makes recommendations to the Board of Supervisors on development plans submitted to the Township, suggests modifications where needed, and recommends appropriate actions. The nature of local government requires that the Board of Supervisors dedicate itself to the many issues of day-to-day operations and the details of land use can often be lost in the mountain of important, but time-consuming demands. The Planning Commission, as an independent advisory body, gives the Board of Supervisors the assurance that the important issues of land use and future growth are given the necessary attention.

### **ZONING HEARING BOARD**

The Zoning Hearing Board (ZHB) has no legislative power; therefore it can neither make nor modify zoning policy. The Zoning Hearing Board does not have enforcement powers. It is a quasi-judicial body; that is, its powers are to some extent judicial in nature. The board schedules hearings on applications and appeals that come before it, takes evidence, and issues written decisions with findings of fact and conclusions of law. A ZHB must limit its scope of activities to those permitted by the Pennsylvania Municipalities Planning Code (MPC) and by the local zoning ordinance.

The primary purpose of the Zoning Hearing Board is to help assure fair and equitable application and administration of the zoning ordinance. They do this by hearing appeals on the zoning officer's determinations and by granting relief from the literal enforcement

of the ordinance in certain hardship situations. The Board consists of a three-member Board with two alternate members. All members of this Board are appointed by the Board of Supervisors and serve five year terms. They meet on demand, the fourth the Tuesday of each month.

### <u>ABOUT PLANNING AND ZONING</u>

Lower Nazareth Township has adopted Zoning and Subdivision & Land Development Ordinances. It is the intent, purpose and scope of these Ordinances to protect and promote the safety, health and morals of the community. These Ordinances attempt to accomplish coordinated development and growth, provide for the general welfare of our constituents by guiding and protecting amenity, convenience, future governmental, economic, practical, and social and cultural facilities, as well as the improvement of governmental processes and functions. They also are tools to guide uses of land and structures, type and location of streets, public grounds and other facilities and to promote the preservation of the community's natural and historic resources and prime agricultural land.

The Township has also adopted a joint municipal comprehensive plan with 9 other municipalities. The township comprehensive plan is generally consistent with the county comprehensive plan. The Township is currently in the process of updating their Zoning Ordinance. This effort is being undertaken in order to have the Zoning Ordinance better conform to the township's comprehensive plan. All of the aforementioned Ordinances are consistent with the requirements of the Municipalities Planning Code (MPC) which is developed by the State Legislature.

The Lower Nazareth Township Planning & Zoning Office is responsible for the front line administration of the subdivision and land development process and the Zoning Ordinance. The staff works in concert with the Township Engineer, Solicitor, Planning Commission, Zoning Hearing Board and Township Manager in the endeavor of processing the numerous activities related to planning and zoning.

### <u>Planning - Subdivision and Land Development Review</u>

All subdivisions and land developments are reviewed by the Township Engineer and the Zoning and Planning Administrator to ensure compliance with both the Subdivision and Land Development Ordinance (SALDO) and the Zoning Ordinance.

The Planning Commission is presented with most subdivision and or land development projects for their comments. The Planning Commission is a 5-Member Board appointed by the Board of Supervisors. Their primary function is to provide comments and recommendations regarding the various projects to the Board of Supervisors.

The Planning Commission meets predominately on the third Monday of every month at 6:30 p.m. in the Lower Nazareth Township Municipal Building. This date may vary depending on holiday conflicts. Please refer to the Township Calendar for actual dates.

### **Zoning**

Lower Nazareth Township adopted its first Zoning Ordinance in 1970. The Zoning Ordinance was most recently amended in December 2023. The purpose of the Zoning Ordinance is to regulate the use of land, regulate the location, use and density of buildings, and provide for the administration and enforcement of the Ordinance. The intent of zoning regulations is to allow a property owner a reasonable use of their land while not causing a detriment to adjoining property owners or the neighborhood.

Every property in Lower Nazareth Township is classified to determine how the property may be used. The zoning classifications outline three types of uses:

- 1. <u>Permitted by Right</u> can be approved by the Zoning Administrator if all conditions are met.
- 2. <u>Special Exception or Variance</u> application for approval must be made to the Zoning Hearing Board.
- 3. <u>Conditional Use</u> application for approval and a public hearing must be held before the Board of Supervisors.

Any use that is permitted only by special exception, variance, or conditional use must apply to the appropriate Board for approval.

### **Property Record Information**

Very often, property owners want to find information about their property such as tax parcel number, sales data, lot dimensions, etc. You can find this information on Northampton County's Public Records Site at <a href="https://www.ncpub.org">www.ncpub.org</a>. An important item to note is that the County's zoning classification often differs from Lower Nazareth Township's. If you are looking for this information, please call the office to confirm the Township's zoning classification.

### When Do I Need A Permit?

A **Zoning Permit** is required **prior to the start** of any of the following activities:

- 1. Erection, construction, movement, placement or expansion of a structure, building or sign;
- 2. Change of the type or expansion of an existing use of a structure or area of land or creation of a new use;
- 3. Grading;
- 4. Demolition of a structure

These activities pertain to accessory buildings or structures including but not limited to detached Garage, Carport, Swimming Pool, Gazebo, Shed, Greenhouse, Children's Playhouse or Children's Play Equipment, post or pier mounted lights, brick or masonry piers, masonry mailboxes, certain types of walls, fences and gates, home office, home occupation, signs, and commercial projects. **Building Permits** may also apply to some of these structures depending on their size and construction.

It is very important to apply for your permit prior to conducting any of the activities above. The Township must confirm that the use is permitted, setbacks are complied with, and that you are not potentially disturbing your septic system.

In general, residential **Building Permits** are required for:

- 1. a new single family dwelling;
- 2. any home addition, including sunrooms and covered patios;
- 3. an accessory structure over 500 square feet;
- 4. a deck over 30" above grade and/or has a roof;
- 5. an above-ground or in-ground pool, more than 24" deep;
- 6. a hot tub;
- 7. retaining walls over 48" high;
- 8. interior alterations that require a structural change;
- 9. a change of a required means of egress;
- 10. addition to, or relocation of any standpipe, water supply, sewer, drainage, drain leader, gas, soil waste, vent or similar piping, electric wiring or mechanical.

A <u>Use and Occupancy Permit</u> is not required when an <u>existing</u> dwelling is sold. However it is required for a <u>new</u> single family dwelling, and for any construction related to a Building Permit. Use and Occupancy Permits are also required for any change in use. Typically, this applies to commercial properties.

Any time you repair, repave (overlay) or reconstruct your driveway, you must apply for a **Driveway Permit**.

<u>Burning Permits</u> are only granted for agricultural/farm properties to burn brush or for those fires set solely for recreational or ceremonial purposes. In general, open burning is prohibited in Lower Nazareth Township.

<u>Peddler's Permits</u> are required for anyone canvassing or soliciting orders or contributions, goods, or merchandise, door-to-door, within Lower Nazareth Township.

Applications for the Permits noted above may be found on the Forms & Publications page of our website (<a href="www.lowernazareth.com">www.lowernazareth.com</a>), or can be picked up at the Municipal Building Monday through Friday, between 7:30 AM and 4:00 PM.

### What are my rights?

- A home improvement contractor must provide you with a copy of the complete contract, free of charge.
- You have the right to rescind your home improvement contract without penalty within three business days of the signing date, except as provided under law for emergency situations.
- A home improvement contract is not enforceable against a consumer if it does not include all of the information required by law.
- A contractor may not demand or receive any payment for a home improvement before the home improvement contract is signed.

## Where can I find my contractor's registration number?

- All contractors must display their official registration number on all contracts, estimates, proposals, and advertisements distributed within the Commonwealth.
- To verify a contractor's registration number, visit the Pennsylvania Office of Attorney General's website at www.attorneygeneral.gov or call toll free 1-888-520-6680.

If you are a homeowner, you will be pleased to know about the Home Improvement Consumer Protection Act. The law affords protections for consumers who hire contractors for home remodeling projects.

Effective July 1, 2009, contractors who perform home improvements totaling \$5,000 or more per year must register with the Office of Attorney General. The law requires written contracts between the contractor and consumer when the price of the project exceeds \$500, and provides for criminal penalties for home improvement fraud and civil penalties for violations of the act. If you are remodeling your home, be sure your contractor is registered with the Office of Attorney General before you sign a contract.

Home improvement fraud occurs when:

- A contractor intentionally provides false or misleading information to convince a consumer to enter into an agreement for home improvements.
- A contractor receives payment and fails to provide the services or materials.
- A contractor damages a person's property in order to solicit an agreement for services or materials.
- A contractor alters a contract or other documents without the consent of the consumer.
- A contractor publishes false or deceptive advertisements.
- A contractor misrepresents material as special order material or misrepresents the cost of special order material.
- A contractor represents himself or herself as an employee of a governmental unit or public utility.

### What do we do?

We are the "Call before you dig!" company for all of Pennsylvania. If you plan to disturb the earth with powered equipment, you are required by Pennsylvania law to notify the underground utility companies of your intent to do so. Notification occurs by calling 8-1-1 or 1-800-242-1776, 24 hours of the day, every day of the year.

We will then notify the utility companies nearby of your intent to dig. The utility companies are responsible to mark where their underground lines are located with colored flags, paint or chalk.

#### Please Note:

- PA One Call does not mark utility lines.
- In some cases, the utility company may not mark the service lines you own.

### Why should you call?

Safe digging is no accident! If you are installing a fence or deck, or digging for a mailbox post, patio or other excavation project, it is important to Know What's Below. Dial 8-1-1 or 1-800-242-1776 before you dig. The utility companies do not want an accident, either. The best way to learn where underground utility lines are located is to call before you dig.

### Homeowner Quick Tips

- One easy phone call to 8-1-1 three to ten business days before digging begins helps keep your neighborhood safe.
- Call on Monday or Tuesday if you plan to dig on Saturday or Sunday.
- The utility companies will mark where their underground lines are located with colored paint, flags or chalk.
- Do not remove the flags if you see them in your yard.
- Our service is no cost to homeowners.
- Did you hire someone to install your fence, deck or new patio? Ask to see the PA One Call serial number before allowing them to dig on your property.

### The Excavator's Responsibility

- Dial 8-1-1 or 1-800-242-1776.
- Do not allow anyone to excavate on your property without calling.
- Always look for the markings on the ground before your dig date.
- If you do not see markings, do not allow anyone to dig. Wait for the lines to be marked by the utility.
- Whoever places the call will receive an email or fax with a list of facility owners who have marked or have not marked.
   Pay attention to this message.
- Respect the markings by not removing flags or disturbing the actual markings.
- Exercise care around the marked lines by hand digging.
- When the project is complete, the excavator should remove the flags or marks from the ground or pavement.
- Report mishaps by dialing 8-1-1.
   Report emergencies by dialing 9-1-1.

### **ABOUT PUBLIC WORKS**

The Lower Nazareth Township Public Works Department strives to maintain safe and clean parks, streets and open spaces. The Department is responsible for street paving, park maintenance, leaf collection, snow removal, street cleaning, and the yard waste recycling program.

There are 55.8 miles of roads in Lower Nazareth Township. The Township is responsible for the maintenance and upkeep of 41.5 of those miles with the remainder being State roads. In addition, the township also owns and maintains 15 traffic signals. The signals are under the jurisdiction of the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation.

### <u>PUBLIC WORKS – SNOW REMOVAL</u>


**Snow Emergency Ordinance #122** makes it unlawful to park, or leave unattended, any vehicle anywhere along a street or highway within the Township or blow or deposit snow in or on any roadway within the Township during a declared Snow Emergency. Although this ordinance applies only during a declared Snow Emergency, the restrictions contained within the ordinance should be adhered to during any winter storm. By doing so, it will allow the Public Works Department to expedite the task of snow removal and therefore, benefit the residents of Lower Nazareth Township.

**Plowing Operations:** It is the Township's policy to first plow the main roads and then the secondary or development roads. This procedure helps to facilitate the flow of higher volumes of traffic and also allows emergency vehicles access to the entire Township as quickly as possible.

**Shoveling Tips:** When clearing your driveway, place the shoveled snow on the side of your driveway opposite the direction of the plow. If possible, try to clear an area next to the road, before your driveway. This will provide an area for the snow from the plow to pile up so it does not fall in your driveway.



**Safety Tips:** Do not allow children to play in or near the streets any time during or after a winter storm. Kids in forts or just standing along the road may not be visible to the plow operator or other vehicles. Also, do not allow anyone to throw snow or other objects at the plows or other vehicles as it may cause an accident.

**Save Your Lawn:** In certain areas, primarily curves and areas without mailboxes, it is very difficult for the plow operator to distinguish between the road and lawn areas. We advise residents to place aluminum or fiberglass flexible reflectorized markers (available at your home improvement store) at these prone locations to assist the operator in locating the lawns. This will significantly reduce the damage done to your lawn and the amount of repairs we need to make in the spring.

**ATV / Snowmobiles:** It is mandatory for all ATV and snowmobile owners to register their vehicles. In addition, both ATV and snowmobile owners must carry liability insurance, except for those used solely on the owner's property for farming or business use. Please respect your neighbor's property and only ride on the lands on which you have permission to ride. Keep in mind that ATVs and snowmobiles are noisy and may be disturbing to your neighbors. Please respect those around you and operate these vehicles at reasonable hours.

**Mailbox Damage:** It is the Township's policy to reimburse property owners, *up to \$25*, for mailbox damage only when the mailbox is actually damaged by the plow or truck. <u>No reimbursement will be paid when damage occurs from snow discharge by the plow</u>. We will evaluate each occurrence of mailbox damage individually. Please contact the Township Office or download from our website the Mailbox Damage Reimbursement form if your mailbox is damaged as a result of snow removal operations within 48 hours of storm ending.

- Brush (natural or untreated wood) 8-inch diameter max and no longer than 8 feet;
   bushes no roots please
- Compost Items hedge trimmings, garden residue & leaves loose or in brown paper bags. NO PLASTIC BAGS!

Unacceptable Material: Grass clippings\*, ornamental grass, sod, soil, straw or hay, and plastic bags!

\*Lower Nazareth Township supports the position of the State Department of Environmental Protection and strongly recommends recycling your grass clippings by using a mulching power.

### CHRISTMAS TREE RECYCLING PROGRAM

Christmas trees will be accepted at the same location as noted above during a predetermined window of time, typically mid January which will be posted on the Township website.

**Special Instructions:** Trees must be free of any ornaments, tinsel and tree bags.

### Earned Income Tax, Local Services Tax, and Real Estate Tax

### **Earned Income Tax (EIT)**

One of Lower Nazareth Township's largest sources of local revenue is our 1.45% earned income tax, which is split .7% for the Nazareth Area School District, .5% for the Township and .25% for Open Space Preservation (effective January 1, 2020). Local income tax in Pennsylvania is based upon where you live rather than where you work.

The Local Tax Enabling Act requires every employer having a factory, workshop, branch, warehouse, or other place of business within the taxing jurisdiction to register with the earned income tax officer of that district. The tax officer will open an Employer Account and issue an Employer Reference Number to be referenced on all EIT submissions. All employers with worksites within the taxing jurisdiction are required by law to deduct the earned income tax from their employees at that site. Employers are required to submit money and detail on a quarterly basis.

Individuals who are self-employed, whose employer does not withhold the earned income tax or if the employer does not withhold the full 1.45% (if that amount still owed is over \$100.00 annually from what the employer withholds) individuals are required to pay quarterly estimated payments. Penalties will be accessed if not paid quarterly. Lower Nazareth Township requires all persons moving in, out, or within the Township to complete a Moving Record. Securing a Moving Record allows the Township to document your moving date and forwarding address. This updated information makes processing your tax documents more convenient for you. The fee for a Moving Record is \$5 and permits may be obtained at the Township Office during normal business hours.

### **Local Services Tax (LST)**

The Local Services Tax (formerly the Emergency Municipal Services Tax) took effect on January 1, 2008. This tax which is \$1.00 per week/\$52.00 per year was levied on any person working in Lower Nazareth Township, whether employed by a company or self – employed.

### **LST Forms**

Local Services Tax Exemption Certificate: You can only claim an exemption if: you will earn less than \$12,000.00 in tax year from all employers located within Lower Nazareth Township and/or you have multiple employers and the tax is already being taken out by another employer (full-time/part-time basis along with the length of employment will determine if the individual will considered exempt). An exemption form will need to be filed with the employer and taxing municipality along with a copy of last year's W-2 or last pay statement.

<u>Local Services Tax Refund</u>: This form is to be used after the year in question has ended. Refunds are issued for individuals that all or part of the \$52.00 was withheld and either they earned less than \$12,000.00 from all Lower Nazareth Township employers and/or

they had multiple employers and the tax was withheld by another employer (depending on full-time/part-time status along with the length of employment will determine if the individual will receive a refund).

Lower Nazareth Township receives 5.50 mills of tax and Northampton County receives 10.80 mills levied on real estate in the Township. The Nazareth Area School District's real estate tax levy is 58.23 mills.

### PARKS LOCATED WITHIN LOWER NAZARETH TOWNSHIP

Lower Nazareth Township believes in recreation facilities for residents of all ages. Preservation of open space for active activities and passive forms such as hiking, fishing, picnicking is a priority. Lower Nazareth is continuously adding public recreational facilities to the township.



### Lower Nazareth Township Park

This 18-acre park is located behind the township building located on Butztown Road. Presently this facility includes: baseball fields, softball fields, multipurpose field for football/lacrosse/soccer, two tennis courts, two basketball courts, shuffleboard, playground equipment, picnic pavilion, bathroom facility, and a concession stand.



### **Newburg Park – May Have Active Construction Zones**

This 90-acre park is located near the intersection of Newburg Road and Gremar Road with the entrance to the park on Gremar Road. Some of the features that have been installed are a Splash Park (seasonal access card needs to be purchased at the township office),1.6 mile paved walking path, playground equipment, bathroom facility, dog park, fields, Veteran's Memorial, gaga ball pit and pickleball courts. Please be very cautious of large construction equipment and stay clear of any active construction zones at the park.



### **Surrey Glen Park**

This 14-acre park is located near the Surrey Glen subdivision, near the intersection of Steuben Road and Georgetown Road. Surrey Glen Park is adjacent to the Monocacy Creek. Playground equipment and an approximately half mile paved walking path were recently installed.

### **Georgetown Road Park**

This 5-acre site situated north of Georgetown Road and Steuben Road is considered to be a "Greenbelt Park." The preserved open space is intended for passive recreation activities such as freeplay or walking.



### **Hahn's Meadow Park**

This beautiful 15-acre park gently traverses meadows and woods along the Monocacy Creek, south of Hanoverville Road. Hahn's Meadow is also considered a "Greenbelt Park" and offers activities such as fishing, walking, and hiking.



### **Louise B. Moore County Park**

Northampton County owns this 125-acre park near Country Club Road in the southeastern part of Lower Nazareth. 

Your registration is not complete until processed and accepted by your County elections office.

If you do not receive your Voter Registration Card within 7-10 days, contact your County elections office.

Your county elections office must receive your application for a mail-in ballot by 5:00 PM on the Tuesday before the election. **Postmarks do not count.**







The following United States Postal Service guidelines apply to the installation of your rural style mailbox on a post in front of your home.

The bottom of the mailbox should be between 41-45" above the ground. The front of the mailbox should be 6-8" in from the back of the curb or edge of the road or shoulder.



The best mailbox supports are stable but bend or fall away if a car hits them. The Federal Highway Administration recommends:

- o Posts should be 4 x 4 inch wood support or a 2" diameter standard steel or aluminum pipe.
- Avoid unyielding and potentially dangerous supports, like heavy metal pipes, concrete posts, and farm equipment (i.e. milk
  cans filled with concrete). <u>Please Note:</u> Lower Nazareth Township has a separate procedure for Masonry or Brick Pier
  Mailboxes prior to installation. Contact the Township Office for information (610-759-7434).
- o Bury your post no more than 24" deep.

Put your house or apartment number on the mailbox. The number on your mailbox should be at least 1 inch high. If your mailbox is on a different street from your house, put your full street address on the mailbox.

Mailboxes must be on the right-hand side of the road and in the carrier's direction of travel in all cases.

A mailbox with a lock must be a model that is USPS approved by the Postmaster General, with a slot large enough to accommodate your daily volume of mail.

Advertising on a mailbox or its supporting post is prohibited.

You may attach a receptacle for newspaper delivery to the post of a curbside mailbox as long as it doesn't:

- Touch or use any part of the mailbox for support.
- o Interfere with mail delivery, obstruct the view of the mailbox flag, or present a hazard to a mailperson or vehicle.
- o Extend beyond the front of the mailbox when the box door is closed.
- Display any advertising, except the publication's title.

It is your responsibility to ensure a clear path to your mailbox so that carriers can safely and efficiently deliver the mail.

If installed properly and the mailbox is damaged by Township snow plowing equipment, you will be reimbursed \$25 toward the mailbox & post. If a mailbox does not conform to the above guidelines, the Township will not be held responsible. You will not be reimbursed for damage received by snow discharging from the snow plow. ### A few landscaping notes:

In Lower Nazareth Township, roadside swales may exist along the front of your property. Installation of landscaping materials around mailboxes will inhibit the designed function of roadside swales or inlets, and could redirect the water to an area where it doesn't belong or prevent water from properly draining from your driveway.



Be observant of the height of your plants - don't plant anything that could cause a visibility problem for someone entering or exiting your driveway.
