Lower Nazareth Township, Northampton County, Pennsylvania

WHEREAS, Lower Nazareth Township, Northampton County, Pennsylvania is most vulnerable to natural and non-natural hazards which may result in loss of life and property, economic hardship, and threats to public health and safety; and

WHEREAS, Section 322 of the Disaster Mitigation Act of 2000 (DMA 2000) requires State and local governments to develop and submit for approval to the President a mitigation plan that outlines processes for identifying their respective natural hazards, risks, and vulnerabilities; and

WHEREAS, Lower Nazareth Township acknowledges the requirements of Section 322 of DMA 2000 to have an approved Hazard Mitigation Plan as a prerequisite to receiving post-disaster Hazard Mitigation Grant Program funds; and

WHEREAS, the Lehigh Valley 2018 Hazard Mitigation Plan has been developed by Lehigh County Emergency Services and the Northampton County Emergency Management Services in cooperation with other county departments, and officials and citizens of Lower Nazareth Township; and

WHEREAS, a public involvement process consistent with the requirements of DMA 2000 was conducted to develop the Lehigh Valley 2018 Hazard Mitigation Plan; and

WHEREAS, the Lehigh Valley 2018 Hazard Mitigation Plan recommends mitigation activities that will reduce losses to life and property affected by natural hazards that face the County and its municipal governments;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the governing body for Lower Nazareth Township:

- The Lehigh Valley 2018 Hazard Mitigation Plan is hereby adopted as the official Hazard Mitigation Plan of Lower Nazareth Township, and
- The respective officials and agencies identified in the implementation strategy of the Lehigh Valley 2018 Hazard Mitigation Plan are hereby directed to implement the recommended activities assigned to them.
