LOWER NAZARETH TOWNSHIP BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MINUTES April 10. 2019

The Lower Nazareth Township Board of Supervisors held their regularly scheduled meeting at the Lower Nazareth Municipal Building on Wednesday April 10, 2019. The Chairman called the meeting to order at 6:30 PM.

Approval of Minutes

A motion was moved by Mr. Hoyer and was seconded by Ms. Templeton to approve the March 27th meeting minutes. The motion carried.

Reports (Reports are available to review at the Township Office and on our website.)

Mr. Pennington acknowledged the receipt of the Hecktown Fire Incident Report for March 2019 as well as the 1st Quarter 2019 Reports for Bethlehem Township Ambulance Services and the Animal Control Officer.

Correspondence

Ms. Stauffer stated that we received letters from two Christian Springs Road residents regarding speeding along their road. She will investigate the complaints.

Ms. Stauffer received a letter from County Executive Lamont McClure regarding the preparation of a countywide Historic and Cultural Assets Plan. The plan will address how historic buildings, communities, and landscapes can strengthen our identity, economic prosperity, and well-being. The project team is seeking input from elected officials and municipal employees. There will be four (4) regional workshops for officials to attend for more information and to provide comments.

Subdivision and Land Development

There was no discussion under Subdivision and Land Development.

Supervisors' Comments

Mr. Smalley reported that he attended the Hecktown Fire Company's monthly meeting.

Mr. Hoyer attend the first Open Space Educational Seminar and reported good attendance and conservation with residents and felt it was all positive. He reminded that the second seminar would be held May 2nd at Lower Nazareth Elementary School.

Mr. Pennington also attended the Open Space Educational Seminar as well as the COG meeting.

Ms. Templeton and Mr. Boucher had no comments.

Engineer's Report

Mr. Kortze reviewed his monthly report to the Board. The final traffic signal along Hanoverville Road has been installed and is scheduled to be energized later this month. He also commented that work at the Community Park is progressing.

Solicitor's Report

<u>Stop Sign Agreement</u> - Solicitor Asteak presented an agreement between the township and Lower Nazareth Commons for the installation on stop signs at Dryland Way and Corriere Road. A motion to approve the agreement was moved by Mr. Boucher and seconded by Mr. Hoyer. The motion carried.

Stop Sign Ordinance Amendment – Authorization to Advertise – A motion to authorize the ordinance for advertisement for the April 24th meeting was moved by Mr. Hoyer and seconded by Ms. Templeton. The motion carried.

Conditional Use Hearing – CU2019-01 Bradley Smith - Mr. Boucher suggested condition #7, requiring the building address to be 24" in height, be removed as he did not feel it applied in this situation. The Board agreed. A motion to approve the amended conditional use opinion and order was moved by Mr. Hoyer and seconded by Mr. Boucher. The motion carried.

Manager's Report

<u>Eagle Scout Project</u> – Ms. Stauffer stated she is working with Marshall Hamilton regarding his Eagle Scout Project. In February he attended a meeting after reaching out to the Township about doing his Eagle Scout Project in our Township Park.

<u>Penn East Pipeline</u> – Ms. Stauffer along with Solicitor Asteak, Mr. Pennington and Upper Nazareth officials, met with representatives from Penn Easton April 3rd. Construction is scheduled to start in late 2019, however not in Lower Nazareth at that time. In August 2019 they will apply for a HOP within Lower Nazareth. Gradwohl Switch and Hecktown Roads will be crossing points. There will be no roads closures as they will bore under the roads.

NAZCOG Multi-Municipal Plan – Ms. Stauffer reported on the top six (6) issues that municipal officials have voted to be the top issues they are facing in their communities. They include truck traffic, warehouses, development stress on utility infrastructure, lack of attainable housing, air & water quality, and balancing preservation and development. While there are 14 issues that will be looked at while updating the plan, these six will be the focus.

<u>Sports Meeting</u> – Ms. Stauffer met with representatives from baseball, football, and basketball on March 25th to discuss finances. She would like to see the organizations become more self-sufficient and rely less on the township. Ms. Stauffer will be meeting with baseball and football on a quarterly basis.

<u>Playground / Park Update</u> — Ms. Stauffer reported that the playground pad has been completed for the May 13th installation. The playground will open later after construction equipment is finished working in that area. Public Works will begin working on the detention pond tomorrow.

Old Business

There was no discussion under Old Business.

New Business

There was no discussion under New Business.

Payment of the Bills

A motion was moved by Ms. Templeton and was seconded by Mr. Smalley to approve payment of the bills dated April 10th. The motion carried.

Courtesy of the Floor

Tammy Kenny, 641 Mulberry Drive, stated she is thrilled about the park however she had a few questions. She inquired on the dog park and Ms. Stauffer said it is still in the plans however it would not be installed until after the soccer fields and parking lot as they are being completed though a grant and we have a deadline for completion. Ms. Kenny inquired about sidewalks along Gremar Road as she foresees many people walking from her development to the park. Ms. Stauffer stated that can be discussed as we move forward. Lastly, Ms. Kenny inquired on the fence around the recycling center. Ms. Stauffer the fence would not be along the property line, it would be a berm. The fence around the facility would be chain link, still unsure if it will also be barbed wire.
