#### LOWER NAZARETH TOWNSHIP BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MINUTES JUNE 12, 2013

The Lower Nazareth Township Board of Supervisors held a regularly scheduled meeting in the Township Municipal Building on Wednesday June 12, 2013. The Chairman called the meeting to order at 6:40 PM.

#### Approval of Minutes

A motion was moved by Mr. Pennington and was seconded by Mr. Kucsan to approve the meeting minutes for May 8, 2013. Mr. Nagle and Mr. Boucher abstained. The motion carried.

#### **Old Business**

<u>4504 Stephanie Drive</u> – Solicitor Asteak contacted Colonial Regional Police and there was only one incident reported since the May meeting. He also noted that he compared our ordinance with other municipalities in, regards to group homes, and it was pretty much on par.

There was a brief discussion on medical treatment facilities and business versus a group home.

Michael Vonelli, 4498 Stephanie Drive, spoke directly to the Board stating that he is looking out for the safety of his community. His issue is with the individuals attending to the gentlemen living in the home. Specifically with the number of cars, profanity, driving in yards and the garbage they leave behind.

Mr. Green spoke to the directors present at the meeting to again ask them to ensure their employees act professionally.

Mr. Nagle stated that all the issues he was hearing were police matters.

Mr. Vonelli wants to be told what to expect and zoning that helps so the police don't need to be called.

Mr. Pennington stated that while it was possible to make changes HIPPA laws protect from sharing personal information. He reminded Mr. Vonelli that you cannot pick your neighbors and this situation is no different than any other bad neighbor that could move in to the neighborhood.

The Board tabled discussion until the June 26th meeting.

Mr. Nagle acknowledged the receipt of the Financial Report for April 2013, the Planning & Zoning Administrator's Report for May 2013 and the Hecktown Volunteer Fire Company Incident Report for May 2013.

#### Correspondence

Borough of Nazareth and Colonial Regional Police – The Township received a letter from Nazareth Borough President Daniel Chiavaroli requesting a response as to whether our municipality still believes a deal can be struck and that the process should continue in order to provide contractual police services to Nazareth Borough.

All Board members agreed that a merger was not in the best interest of the Township and its residents. A motion was moved by Mr. Kucsan and was seconded by Mr. Pennington to authorize Solicitor Asteak to relay to Mr. Chiavaroli that Lower Nazareth Township is not interested in a merger at this time. The motion carried.

#### Subdivision and Land Development

<u>Louise Moore Park</u> – Present was Andrew Bohl, P.E., Hanover Engineering and Gordon Heller, Superintendent, Parks and Recreation Division.

<u>SALDO Waiver Requests</u> – The applicant has requested 38 waivers. Mr. Tenges wanted the applicant to explain some of their reasons for the requests because he believes some of the items should be required, but the Township does not want to burden the County financially. Solicitor Asteak agreed that some of the SALDO requirements would not be applicable to this particular site plan. After a brief discussion, a motion was moved by Mr. Green and was seconded by Mr. Boucher to approve all requested waivers, except for 424.9(h), 520, 533.10, and 901. The motion carried.

<u>Final Site Plan – Resolution #LNT-14-13</u> – The proposal is to convert an existing residence into a park office building. In addition, one of the existing driveways would be widened and paved, unnecessary structures removed, and twenty-two off-street parking spaces constructed. A motion was moved by Mr. Kucsan and was seconded by Mr. Pennington to approve Resolution #LNT-14-13. The motion carried.

#### **Supervisors' Comments**

Mr. Kucsan, Mr. Nagle and Mr. Boucher had no comments.

Mr. Pennington attended to CRPC and the COG meetings. At the COG meeting they discussed electronics recycling options and the Household Hazardous Waste Event that was held on June 1<sup>st</sup>.

Mr. Green read a statement advising the residents of Lower Nazareth, that the Board of the now defunct Hecktown Ambulance Corp is attempting to give property, equipment, and all assets of Hecktown Ambulance Corp to Bethlehem Township Fire Company it what term a merger. This property and equipment was paid for by donations from Township residents, tax monies from the Township and the hard work and dedication of past volunteers. He asked the Board to give approval to the Solicitor to investigate if legal action can be taken to stop this merger. A motion was moved by Mr. Boucher and was seconded by Mr. Green to authorize Solicitor Asteak to investigate if any legal action can be taken to stop the merger. The motion carried.

#### Manager's Report

<u>Time Extension Report</u> – Mr. Tenges reported that the Township accepted three time extensions; Greenfield Industrial Park Final Land Development through August 22, 2013; First Industrial – First Park 33 Subdivision through July 10, 2013; and First Industrial – First Park 33 Land Development through July 10, 2013.

COG Meeting – Mr. Tenges also attended the COG meeting.

<u>623 Municipal Drive</u> – Mr. Tenges reported that 623 Municipal Drive is now under the control of Lower Nazareth Township.

<u>Christian Springs Road Drainage Improvements</u> – Mr. Tenges reported that he hopes to begin the drainage improvements on Christian Springs Road soon. Once they start, the project should take about 3 weeks. **Board of Supervisors Minutes** 

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#### Engineer's Report

<u>Trio Farms – Fields at Trio Phase I – Security Reduction</u> – Mr. Lawler reviewed Mr. Kortze's letter recommending a \$4,967.31 reduction in security. A motion was moved by Mr. Pennington and was seconded by Mr. Boucher to grant the reduction. The motion carried.

<u>Trio Farms – Fields at Trio Phase II – Security Reduction</u> – Mr. Lawler reviewed Mr. Kortze's letter recommending a \$35,953.50 reduction in security. A motion was moved by Mr. Green and was seconded by Mr. Kucsan to grant the reduction. The motion carried.

#### Solicitor's Report

<u>Phillips Feed Development Improvements Agreement – Authorization to Execute</u> – A motion was moved by Mr. Pennington and was seconded by Mr. Boucher to authorize the execution of the agreement. The motion carried.

#### **New Business**

There were no items to discuss under New Business.

#### Payment of the Bills

A motion was moved by Mr. Kucsan and was seconded by Mr. Boucher to approve payment of the bills dated June 12, 2013. The motion carried.

#### Courtesy of the Floor

Paul Fehnel, Georgetown Road, stated that last year a storm took out three trees and they ended up across the creek. They are still there and he wants to know when the Township is going to remove them. He also commented on trees that need to be trimmed along Georgetown Road. Mr. Tenges stated that the Public Works Department has been very busy and will take care of it as soon as they can; hopefully this summer.

#### Adjournment

A motion was moved by Mr. Boucher and was seconded by Mr. Pennington to adjourn the meeting. The meeting adjourned at 8:00pm.
