LOWER NAZARETH TOWNSHIP BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MINUTES June 12, 2019

The Lower Nazareth Township Board of Supervisors held their regularly scheduled meeting at the Lower Nazareth Municipal Building on Wednesday June 12, 2019. The Chairman called the meeting to order at 6:50 PM.

Conditional Use Hearing - CU2019-02 - Jaindl 248 Warehouse

Solicitor Asteak opened the conditional use hearing with a brief description of the application. The proposed use is the land development and construction of two warehouses. The property location is Easton-Nazareth Hwy/Route 248, specifically Tax Map Parcel #K8-7-1. The property is zoned Light Industrial Campus (LI).

Present for the hearing and giving testimony was Attorney Joseph Zator; David Jaindl, Jaindl Land Company; Kirk Johnson, Watson Land Company; and Rick Roseberry, Maser Engineering. Attorney Zator noted that this proposed project is a joint venture between Jaindl and Watson Land Company.

Mr. Jaindl testified that they intend to develop two warehouses on this property. He discussed the CCR (code, covenants, and restrictions) deed restrictions, they will impose that go beyond the Township's minimum.

Mr. Roseberry noted that they have been before the Township's Planning Commission and they recommended approval and received a letter from the Lehigh Valley Planning Commission (LVPC) recommending that it's a project consistent with the county's comprehensive plan.

Mr. Rosebery discussed the property's location and surrounding properties. The plan is to divide the existing 61.495-acre lot into a 17.3-acre and 43.89-acre lot with a warehouse on each lot. Mr. Roseberry then discussed access and traffic circulation and volume. The driveway to the property will be built to public road standards in an attempt in the future to connect Route 248 to Route 191. If this were to happen the developer intends to dedicate the roadway to the Township.

Mr. Hoyer expressed concern about traffic at Route 248 and Hollo Road. Turning onto Route 248 from Hollo Road is already difficult and will only get worse with this development. He stated that he does not care if PennDOT says it's not warranted; he wants a traffic light at that intersection and that it be made a condition of approval. Solicitor Asteak asked the applicant if PennDOT said a traffic signal could be installed would they agree to install one? Mr. Jaindl agreed to have his traffic engineer re-evaluate the intersection and speak with PennDOT.

Mr. Johnson discussed tenants and fire suppression. He stated they will comply with township, state, and federal regulations pertaining to smoke, dust, odor, air pollutants, noise, vibration, light, glare, electronic disturbances, water, and chemical pollutants.

Mr. Matthew Mikol, 3966 Hollo Road, was very upset about this proposed development. One concern is his fear that this project will cause his nearby property, which is preserve farmland, to be devalued. His other concern is the intersection of Route 248 and Hollo Road. He asked that the Board put off a decision until Mr. Jaindl has the intersection re-evaluated.

Solicitor Asteak closed the hearing at 8:20pm.

Mr. Pennington stated that the Board would defer a decision so the Board can review all the information.

Ms. Stauffer asked the applicant to provide a time extension for their land development plan through July 31st. Attorney Zator and Mr. Jaindl said they would send a letter.

Approval of Minutes

A motion was moved by Mr. Hoyer and was seconded by Mr. Boucher to approve the May 22nd meeting minutes. Mr. Smalley abstained. The motion carried.

Reports (Reports are available to review at the Township Office and on our website.)

Mr. Pennington acknowledged the receipt of the Hecktown Fire Incident Report for May 2019.

Correspondence

There was no discussion under Correspondence.

Subdivision and Land Development

<u>Trio Farms Phase 7</u> — Ms. Stauffer reported that at the previous meeting the Board approve Resolution #LNT-12-19 for the Trio Farms Phase 7 project. The applicant is required to accept the terms within the resolution within 5 days. The applicant instead altered the language in the resolution. Ms. Stauffer stated the applicant is requesting earth movement prior to the conditions being met and recording of the plan. Solicitor Asteak stated he will ask the applicant to sign off on the original resolution, sign an indemnification agreement, and post security prior to earth movement. A motion was moved by Mr. Smalley and was seconded by Mr. Hoyer to approve the indemnification agreement. The motion carried.

Supervisors' Comments

Mr. Pennington reported that the COG is discussing the possibility of members collectively joining an emergency services notification system program, like Nixel, in order to save money. Once proposal was \$2,000/annually per municipality. Township Supervisors were interested in getting more information. Mr. Pennington also reported on COG members collectively forming a property maintenance board of appeals. Mr. Hoyer stated concern of a property maintenance code going beyond dealing with excessive

junk on a property to going after property owners for design styles. Finally, Mr. Pennington commented that the Multi Municipal Comp Plan update continues moving forward.

Ms. Templeton had no comments.

Mr. Boucher had no comments.

Mr. Hoyer stated an ordinance will need to be drafted to implement the Open Space Program. He hopes by late July / early August will begin accepting names of individuals to sit on the committee. Mr. Hoyer said the additional EIT tax will be implemented in the fall of 2020. Ms. Stauffer commented that she will call voter registration for election results so we can proceed with drafting the ordinance.

Mr. Smalley reported that he attended the Open Space meeting with Gilmore & Associates as well as the Hecktown Fire Company monthly meeting.

Engineer's Report

O.R.E. Letter of Credit Reduction – Mr. Kortze reviewed his letter recommending the reduction in security. A motion was moved by Mr. Boucher and was seconded by Ms. Templeton to reduce the letter of credit. The motion carried.

Solicitor's Report

<u>Township Auditor Vacancy</u> – The Board of Supervisors acknowledged the receipt of Jake Towne's resignation from the Board of Auditor's, effective July 4th. Solicitor Asteak declared the position vacant. A motion was moved by Mr. Boucher and was seconded by Ms. Templeton to authorize the Township Manager to begin the search for an individual to finish out the term. The motion carried.

Manager's Report

<u>Christian Springs Road Update</u> – Ms. Stauffer commented that after the last meeting a resident reached out to hear and threatened to sue the township in rumble strips were installed on Christian Springs Road. She stated that she cannot put the Township in this position; therefore, rumble strips will not be installed as previously reported.

Official Map Ordinance — Ms. Stauffer shared a proposal from Gilmore & Associates for our Official Map Ordinance project at a cost of \$8,480.00. Ms. Stauffer noted that the Township has applied for a \$4,200 grant towards this project. A motion was moved by Mr. Hoyer and was seconded by Ms. Templeton to contract with Gilmore & Associates to produce the official map for the Township effective July 1, 2019. The motion carried.

<u>Certificates of Deposit Renewal – Resolution #LNT-17-19</u> – Ms. Stauffer reported that our certificates of deposits at Merchant's Bank will mature on June 25th. She proposed to transfer those funds to Lafayette Ambassador Bank into certificates of deposits at a higher interest rate. A motion was moved by Mr. Hoyer and was seconded by Mr. Boucher to approve Resolution #LNT-17-19 to invest funds in certificates of deposits at Lafayette Ambassador Bank. The motion carried.

Old Business

There was no discussion under Old Business.

New Business

There was no discussion under New Business.

Payment of the Bills

A motion was moved by Mr. Boucher and was seconded by Ms. Templeton to approve payment of the bills dated June 12th. The motion carried.

Courtesy of the Floor

Jeff Shepherd, 4485 Whitetail Drive, was happy with the installation of speed radar devices throughout the township.
