#### LOWER NAZARETH TOWNSHIP BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MINUTES AUGUST 21, 2013

The Lower Nazareth Township Board of Supervisors held a regularly scheduled meeting in the Township Municipal Building on Wednesday August 21, 2013. The Vice Chairman called the meeting to order at 6:30 PM.

#### Approval of Minutes

A motion was moved by Mr. Green and was seconded by Mr. Boucher to approve the meeting minutes for July 10, 2013. Mr. Pennington abstained. The motion carried.

Reports (Reports are available to review at the Township Office and on our website.)

Mr. Pennington acknowledged the receipt of the Financial Statement for June & July 2013, also the Hecktown Volunteer Fire Company Incident Report for July 2013 and the Planning and Zoning Administrator's Report for July 2013.

#### Correspondence

There were no items to discuss under Correspondence.

#### Subdivision and Land Development

### Subdivision of First Park 33 Preliminary/Final Subdivision - Waiver Requests

Mr. Kortze reviewed his August 5, 2013 letter addressing the waivers requests. Mr. Kortze stated that the developer would like Section 421, the minimum plan scale of 1" = 50' and allow a scale of 1" = 60' for the Subdivision Plan. The smaller scale allows the entire subdivision parcel to be shown on a single plan sheet. They also asked that the section 774.32.e, the section of SALDO which requires that all detention basins have a minimum bottom slope of 1.0. The Applicant is requesting that the Township grant this waiver to allow flat bottom ponds for storm water infiltration purposes. The Applicant has also asked for a waiver on Section 782.21 and 782.22 – Utility Easements. These sections require easements outside of the right-of-way of roads and along the side and rear property lines. Applicant state that all utilities required for future development of the three subdivided parcels is shown on the plans and that utility easements, along with tree protection, buffer yard and drainage easements are shown on the plans where required. The applicant requests waiver from the above referenced sections to define additional utility easements areas. The final request was for Section 749.2 – Sidewalks. Applicant requests a deferral from requirements to provide sidewalk along Rt. 248 frontage of proposed lot 1 and 3, and along the north side of Eastgate Boulevard along the frontage of Lot 3. They felt that if the Township gives consideration to granting a deferral for some portion of sidewalk that would not directly serve

the planned development on Lot 2, Mr. Kortze stated that any deferral should contain conditions/guarantees that sidewalk will be completed within a specified period of time. Mr. Kortze stated he was fine with all three of the waivers and the one deferral. A motion was moved by Mr. Green and was seconded by Mr. Boucher to approve Waiver Requests as well as the one deferral. The motion passed.

<u>Subdivision of First Park 33 Preliminary/Final Subdivision- Resolution # LNT-16-13</u> – The developer has proposed a plan for a three lot subdivision of a 58.89 acre tract on the west side of Route 248 in the vicinity of Route 33.

Attorney Eric Schock was in attendance, whose firm's client; Mandy Partners owns land adjacent to this property and asked if the Supervisors would consider requiring an easement for access to an adjoining tract with terms to be negotiated at a later time.

Attorney Elizabeth Witmer representing First Industrial stated that the developer has a problem with this request for an easement due to the fact that the adjacent property is not land locked and has yet to be developed.

Mr. Tenges spoke on the matter and said that he had been in discussion with both parties for the entire period. Mr. Tenges felt that the township is neutral in their position and that this is an issue that the two parties should settle between themselves. This opinion was reflected by the board and did not feel they needed to grant an easement at this time and that it is a matter that should be resolved between the two parties directly.

Mr. Kortze reviewed his August 5<sup>th</sup> letter recommending Conditional Preliminary/Final Approval. A motion was moved by Mr. Kucsan and seconded by Mr. Green to grant Conditional Preliminary/Final Approval. The motion carried.

Lot 2 in First Park 33 Preliminary/Final Land Development- waiver Requests – Mr. Kortze discussed his August 5<sup>th</sup> letter discussing the requested waivers, specifically reiterating the points discussed earlier where the developer asked for a waiver relating to the minimum plan scale as well as a waiver to allow for the use of a flat bottom pond for the use of storm water infiltration. Mr. Kortze recommended approving the sought after wavers.

A motion was moved by Mr. Boucher and was seconded by Mr. Kucsan to approve the waivers request. The motion carried.

Lot 2 in First Park 33 Preliminary/Final Land Development – Resolution #LNT-17-13 — The intent of this plan is construction of two distribution warehouse with a cumulative area of 584,750 s.f. on Lot 2 of the First Park 33 three-lot subdivision. Mr. Kortze read from his letter dated August 5<sup>th</sup> and voiced his concern for class 5 injection wells that are purposed for the movement of storm water, due to the fact they are relatively new and require maintenance for their mechanical parts. Mr. Green as well as Mr. Boucher voiced their concerns with this means of disposal of storm water into wells. The developer stated that these wells will be installed with an E.P.A. permit which will require continued maintenance of the system. Mr. Kortze also interjected that these class 5 injection wells are recognized by D.E.P. and the E.P.A. and are classified as a viable option. After further discussion a motion was made for Resolution #LNT-17-13 by Mr. Kucsan and seconded by Mr. Boucher. Mr. Green voted no the motion carried 3 – 1.

<u>Keystone Real Estate Management – (Milham) – Preliminary Subdivision</u> – The applicant is proposing to acquire an 18+/- acre parcel from the adjoining property owner to the east. The lot will be combined with the existing dealership property to create a 35.25 acre parcel, shown as lot 1. Lot #2 of this subdivision will be retained by the current owner of record.

Mr. Kortze reviewed his August 16<sup>th</sup> letter recommending Preliminary approval. A motion was moved by Mr. Green and was seconded by Mr. Boucher for preliminary approval. The motion carried.

Board of Supervisors Minutes August 21, 2013 <u>Keystone Real Estate Management – (Milham) – Preliminary Land Development</u> The submitted material depicts the expansion of an existing automobile dealership located on the north side of Hecktown Road and east of PA Route 33. The Applicant intends to construct a new dealership, a body shop and a car wash to the north and east of the existing building. Mr. Kortze reviewed his August 16<sup>th</sup>, letter and stated that he recommends approval of the Preliminary Land Development. A motion was moved by Mr. Green and seconded by Mr. Boucher for Preliminary Land Development. The motion carried.

<u>Saratoga Farms – Zoning Map Amendment</u> – This amendment will change the zoning in this purposed subdivision from Agricultural to Low Density Residential. The main reason for this change is so that the lots can be built on 1 acre lots instead of 1.5 acre lots that are required within an agricultural zone. A motion for the zoning map amendment was made by Mr. Green and seconded by Mr. Boucher. The motion carried.

#### **Supervisors' Comments**

Mr. Kucsan, Mr. Green, and Mr. Boucher had no comments.

Mr. Pennington stated he attended the Police Commission Meeting.

#### Manager's Report

<u>Time Extension Report</u> – Mr. Tenges reported that the Township accepted two time extensions; the first is for Brown Daub Fiat and will extend until 10/27/2013. The second extension is for IDI's conditional use and is indefinite.

Mr. Tenges also state that work was being done to re-tool the web site over the next few months.

Mr. Tenges also reported that he was recently elected the President of the Pennsylvania Association of Municipal Administrators.

#### Engineer's Report

Fields at Trio Farms Phase I – Letter of Credit Reduction – Mr. Kortze reviewed his August 16<sup>th</sup> letter and recommended that the Letter of Credit be reduced from \$274,024.63 to \$268,055.20. A motion was made by Mr. Boucher to authorize the reduction and was seconded by Mr. Kucsan. The motion carried.

Fields at Trio Farms Phase II – Letter of Credit Reduction – Mr. Kortze reviewed his August 16<sup>th</sup> letter and recommended that the Letter of Credit be reduced from \$346,492.30 to \$146,732.30. A motion was made by Mr. Green to authorize the reduction and was seconded by Mr. Kucsan. The motion carried.

#### Solicitor's Report

There were no items to discuss under Solicitor's Report.

#### **Old Business**

<u>4504 Stephanie Drive</u> – Mr. Pennington stated that attorney Asteak has been researching how other municipalities handle group homes and will be meeting with the Supervisors in the near future to discuss his findings.

#### **New Business**

There were no items to discuss under New Business.

#### Payment of the Bills

A motion was moved by Mr. Boucher and was seconded by Mr. Kucsan to approve payment of the bills dated Board of Supervisors Minutes August 21, 2013

August 21, 2013. The motion carried.

#### Courtesy of the Floor

<u>Doris Burritt</u>, 3323 Newburg Rd, wanted to speak about the blinking light on Georgetown Rd, and asked the Supervisors if anything can be done to try and make that intersection safer. She stated that she has seen many accidents, as well as many near misses and wondered if it would be possible to place a sign for the upcoming blinking light could be installed.

<u>Doug Walker</u>, 659 Georgetown Rd, also wanted to reiterate the danger at this intersection. Mr. Walker stated he didn't know what could be done for this intersection but pleaded with the supervisors to do whatever they could to make this intersection safer for this community.

Mr. Tenges, said that the township can look at the traffic signal warrants. Mr. Tenges said the township can start here because an intersection must meet certain criteria for a traffic signal.

Mr. Pennington, said that the township would start with this and report back next month on its findings.

Michael Vonelli, 4498 Stephanie Drive, reiterated his concerns regarding the activities at 4504 Stephanie Drive, and wanted to show his displeasure that more has not been done yet.

#### Adjournment

A motion was moved by Mr. Boucher and was seconded by Mr. Green to adjourn the meeting. The meeting adjourned at 8:22pm.
