# LOWER NAZARETH TOWNSHIP BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MINUTES October 27, 2010

The Lower Nazareth Township Board of Supervisors held a regularly scheduled meeting in the Township Municipal Building on Wednesday October 27, 2010. The Chairman called the meeting to order at 6:30 PM.

#### **Approval of Minutes**

A motion was moved by Mr. Pennington and was seconded by Mr. Kucsan to approve the meeting minutes for October 13, 2010. The motion carried.

Mr. Nagle acknowledged the receipt of the Financial Statement for September 2010.

#### Manager's Report

\*\*\* Mr. Tenges requested an executive session following the meeting to discuss legal and real estate matters. \*\*\*

<u>Time Extension Report</u> – Mr. Tenges reported that a time extension was accepted for the Mocha Abe – Preliminary/Final Land Development plan submission. The extension was granted through October 31, 2011.

<u>Draft 2011 Budget</u> – Mr. Tenges stated that we will need to authorize the budget for advertisement at our November 17<sup>th</sup> meeting and will be up for approval at our final meeting of the year. December 15<sup>th</sup>.

Board of Supervisors Minutes October 27, 2010 Mr. Tenges reviewed the different scenarios and police budget numbers. Mr. Tenges also stated he would be meeting with a consultant to discuss debt service.

Mr. Tenges discussed Monday evening's CRPC meeting and provided a solution to the budget problem. The formula should be 30/40/30 - population, incidents, and assessed values. There was discussion on how to get a valid population count since LVPC's numbers are rough estimates. Also discussed was using last year's incident numbers for the coming year's budget – to eliminate any guesstimates. The main goal is to establish stability in the formula.

It was suggested that CRPC use 2010 computations and use cash reserves to balance the budget until all details can be worked out. A special meeting will be held on November 3<sup>rd</sup> to discuss this matter.

<u>Authorization to advertise use of CPA to perform 2010 Audit</u> – A motion was moved by Mr. Pennington and was seconded by Mr. Boucher to advertise the use of a CPA to conduct the 2010 audit. The motion carried.

<u>PADOT Agility Agreement – Resolution #LNT-22-10</u> – This is for shared services with PADOT. A motion was moved by Mr. Pennington and was seconded by Mr. Boucher to approve Resolution #LNT-22-10. The motion carried.

DeBonis Hearing – Mr. Tenges reported that the Debonis case went to trial this week.

#### **Engineer's Report**

<u>Hidden Oaks Phase 2 & 3 – Maintenance Period Expiration / Letter of Credit Release</u> – Justin Huratiak, Sterling Properties, was present. Mr. Kortze reviewed his October 27<sup>th</sup> letters recommending the release of the letter of credit, for both Phase 2 and Phase 3, once all documents have been received. Mr. Tenges discussed deficiencies including a driveway issue at 4472 Oakwood Lane. Mr. Tenges requested that Mr. Kortze send a letter to the homeowner at 4472 Oakwood Lane to remove the pipe and return the driveway to its previous condition.

A motion was moved by Mr. Pennington and was seconded by Mr. Boucher to release the letter of credit, for Phase 2, upon the receipt of the deed of dedication. The motion carried.

A motion was moved by Mr. Kucsan and was seconded by Mr. Pennington to release the letter of credit, for Phase 3, upon the receipt of the deed of dedication. The motion carried.

<u>Tractor Supply – Maintenance Period Expiration / Letter of Credit Release</u> - Mr. Kortze reviewed his October 25<sup>th</sup> letter recommending the release of the letter of credit. A motion was moved by Mr. Boucher and was seconded by Mr. Pennington to release the letter of credit. The motion carried.

#### Solicitor's Report

<u>C & S Wholesalers - Land Development Improvements Agreement - Authorization to Execute</u> - A motion was moved by Mr. Pennington and was seconded by Mr. Boucher to authorize the agreement for execution upon the language approval by Mr. Tenges and Solicitor Asteak. The motion carried.

NASD/Kenyon Energy Zoning Appeal — Solicitor Asteak reported that the Zoning Appeal for Nazareth School District / Kenyon Energy was tabled because they could not produce a lease. It was allegedly on Dr. Lesky's desk.

<u>DeBonis Case</u> – Solicitor Asteak reported that the DeBonis case went to trial this week. Mr. Tenges, Mr. Kortze and Solicitor Asteak have been attending.

<u>Ashley Development / Trio Farms Zoning Appeal</u> – Solicitor Asteak reported that the Trio Zoning Appeal will be heard in County Court on December 7<sup>th</sup>.
