LOWER NAZARETH TOWNSHIP BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MINUTES April 28, 2021

The Lower Nazareth Township Board of Supervisors held a virtual meeting on Wednesday April 28, 2021. The Vice-Chairman called the meeting to order at 7:10PM.

***The Board held an executive session prior to this evening's meeting to discuss legal matters. ***

The Board held a moment of silence for Sgt. Harmon, a 25-year member of Colonial Regional Police. Sgt. Harmon passed away April 22, 2021.

Approval of Minutes

A motion was moved by Mr. Hoyer and was seconded by Mr. Brown to approve the April 14th meeting minutes. The motion carried unanimously.

Reports (Reports are available to review at the Township Office and on our website.) Mr. Boucher acknowledged the receipt of the Financial Report for March 2021.

Supervisor's Comments

Mr. Boucher attended the CRPD meeting on Monday. He stated they are down to 18 applicants and are looking to hire 2-3 new officers.

Mr. Brown reported that the Open Space Committee met last week. He stated the dog park is under construction. Unfortunately, we did not get the DCED grant for Surrey Glen Park but we have been awarded a \$100,000 grant from Northampton County. The committee recommends moving forward with the playground and trail spees which the Township Manager will discuss under her reports.

Mr. Hoyer noted that the EAC's next meeting is May 10th. They are working on an application. In other news, he reported that, unfortunately after over 35 years of service to the community, the Hecktown Lower Nazareth Lions Club will disband. The decision comes due to aging members and the lack of new members. In the process, they have money to donate to various organizations. They will be purchasing two benches for the Township Parks and a tree in memory of Lions Club Members. In addition, they will be purchasing equipment for Hecktown Fire Company and donating funds to various recipients including the Nazareth Memorial Library, Colonial Regional Police. Solicitor Asteak noted the Lions Club did a great job over the years; Mr. Hoyer and Mr. Kucsan were major players.

Board of Supervisors Minutes April 28, 2021

Subdivision & Land Development

Stone Briar II – Rezoning Request – Attorney Piperato, Ron DelSerro, Nico DelSerro, and Lou Rauch were in attendance. Attorney Piperato gave a brief presentation.

Mr. Hoyer inquired why Mr. DelSerro wants to develop that land. He also does not see the need for 1 acre lots versus 1.5 acres. He prefers to keep it zoned Agricultural. Attorney Piperato noted that people do not want to maintain large lots today. Mr. Rauch stated they gain of three lots with the smaller lots. Mr. Brown does not see the need to rezone to get to smaller lots.

Mr. Boucher stated the Board would think it over and asked the applicant to return on May 12th.

Grace Church – Nicole Galio for Collier Engineering and representatives from Grace Church were in attendance. Ms. Galio gave a brief presentation of the project which is located along the border between Bethlehem and Lower Nazareth Township at 4301 Hecktown Road. The site lies almost entirely within Bethlehem Township and only a small portion of the property is in Lower Nazareth. Bethlehem Township is requiring road widening; a portion of the widening area is within Lower Nazareth. They will dedicate the ROW to Lower Nazareth. There will also be a storm sewer inlet. A motion was moved by Mr. Hoyer and seconded by Mr. Brown to accept the proposal as presented. Solicitor Asteak requested a copy of the plan and he will prepare and record the grant of ROW. The motion carried unanimously.

Solicitor's Report

<u>LVTC II Stormwater Improvements Agreement</u> – A motion was moved by Mr. Brown and seconded by Mr. Hoyer to authorize execution of the agreement upon receipt from the developer. The motion carried unanimously.

<u>Authorization to Advertise Snow Removal Ordinance</u> – Solicitor Asteak noted that Mr. Hoyer requested a warning be included in the ordinance. He believes a warning should not be a part of the ordinance but part of our enforcement policy. A motion was moved by Mr. Hoyer and seconded by Mr. Brown to authorize advertisement of the ordinance. The motion carried unanimously.

Engineer's Report

Newburg Inn Demolition – Mr. Kortze noted the request for bids has been advertised. Bids are due May 21st and there is a pre-bid meeting on May 5th. The specs are advertised on Penn Bid. When Mr. Kortze checked, 44 companies had shown an interest and 40 downloaded the specs.

Manager's Report

<u>Security cameras</u> – Ms. Stauffer reported that the security cameras at 623 have been installed and are up and running. The cameras at 195 are scheduled to be installed on May 10th.

<u>Paving project</u> – The project is scheduled to begin on May 10th starting on Gradwohl Switch Road and continuing to Country Club Road. Once the starting date in finalized, letters will go out to residents. The entire project should take 7-10 days to complete.

<u>Authorization to purchase playground equipment – Surrey Glen Park</u> – Ms. Stauffer noted that while we did not get the DCED grant we have been awarded a \$100,000 Northampton County Livable Landscapes grant. The total cost of the playground is \$172,706.85 Once installed, it will be mulched, and available to the public. Once the order is placed, it will be about 6 weeks until the equipment is received. The project should be completed in about 2-3 months. A motion was moved by Mr. Brown and seconded by Mr. Hoyer to approve the equipment purchase. The motion carried unanimously.

<u>Authorization to advertise trail specs – Surrey Glen Park</u> – Ms. Stauffer requested authorization for Mr. Kortze to complete the trail specs and advertise immediately. A motion was moved by Mr. Hoyer and seconded by Mr. Brown to authorize the advertisement of the trail specs. The motion carried unanimously.

<u>Authorization to purchase generator and transfer switches – 306 Butztown Road</u> – Ms. Stauffer reported that the Township was awarded a grant from Northampton County to repave the parking lot. That project cannot begin until the generator is installed. It is less expensive for us to buy the generator ourselves through Costars and then pay for the installation. The cost of the generator through Dynatech is \$19,599 and will be purchased from the Capital Reserve Fund.

Mr. Hoyer inquired on the pad for the generator. Ms. Stauffer reported that the Township is pouring the pad for the generator. She also noted that the cost for the installation is less than the \$20,000 bid requirement parameter. She is getting quotes for certified electricians for connect the generator.

Mr. Hoyer inquired about regular testing on the equipment. Ms. Stauffer reported that the equipment will perform self-tests on a weekly basis.

A motion was moved by Mr. Brown and seconded by Mr. Hoyer to approve the generator purchase. The motion carried unanimously.

<u>Greenways, Trails, and Recreation Grant Application – LNT-21-21</u> – Ms. Stauffer requested approval of the resolution to allow the Township to apply for this grant towards the splash pad, maintenance building, fencing, and pavilion. A motion was moved by Mr. Hoyer and was seconded by Mr. Brown to approve Resolution #LNT-21-21. The motion carried unanimously.

Payment of the Bills

A motion was moved by Mr. Brown and was seconded by Mr. Hoyer to approve payment of the bills dated April 28th. The motion carried unanimously.

Courtesy of the Floor

Travis Gerould, township resident, was in attendance via Zoom and commented that the quality of the sound tonight was terrible. Township Staff reported we were aware of the technical difficulties and would have the equipment checked tomorrow.

Mr. Gerould also asked why the Township was installing the generator at 306 before the main facility at 623. Mr. Brown reported that we have a grant to repave the 306 parking lot and that cannot be completed prior to the generator install.

Adjournment

The meeting adjourned at 8:02PM.
