LOWER NAZARETH TOWNSHIP BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MINUTES August 11, 2021

The Lower Nazareth Township Board of Supervisors held a virtual meeting on Wednesday August 11, 2021. The Chairman called the meeting to order at 7:00PM.

Agenda Approval

Steve Brown requested to add, under Parks & Recreation, authorization to pay Met-Ed for the electric install at Newburg Park. A motion was moved by Mr. Boucher and was seconded by Mr. Hoyer to add this item to the agenda. The motion carried unanimously.

<u>Liquor License Hearing – Top Star 261 Nazareth Pike</u> - Resolution #LNT-23-21

Solicitor Asteak opened the hearing at 7:04pm. Attorney Berger, Norris McLaughlin, gave a presentation. Top Star intends to sell beer and possibly wine. The product will be stored in coolers which will be locked during hours when sales are not permitted. Minor interior modifications will be made to the existing store. Food will move in expanded area and beer and the required seating area will be in the existing space. Attorney Berger also reviewed training for sales and restrictions for consumption on premises.

A motion was moved by Mr. Boucher and was seconded by Mr. Brown to approve Resolution #LNT-23-21. The motion carried unanimously.

Approval of Minutes

A motion was moved by Mr. Hoyer and was seconded by Mr. Boucher to approve the July 28th meeting minutes. The motion carried unanimously.

Reports (Reports are available to review at the Township Office and on our website.)

Mr. Pennington acknowledged the receipt of the Financial Report for June 2021 and the Hecktown Fire Incident Report for July 2021, and the Bethlehem Vol Fire – Ambulance Reports 1st & 2nd Quarters 2021.

Supervisor's Comments

Mr. Pennington attended the NAZCOG meeting on Monday August 9th.

Mr. Boucher had no comments.

Board of Supervisors Minutes

^{*}The Board held an executive session prior to this evening's meeting to discuss legal & real estate matters. *

Mr. Brown reported that the Township has received a \$50,000 grant CDBG Grant for the Phase I development at Hahn's Meadow Park. This, along with the \$47,118.38 Livable Landscapes Grant means this project will be fully funded by grants.

Mr. Brown reported that Met-Ed has granted final approval for the electric at Newburg Park. The cost for the installation is \$62,718.27. Once the invoice is paid, work can be scheduled. A motion was moved by Mr. Boucher and seconded by Mr. Brown to authorize payment to Met-Ed. The motion carried unanimously.

Mr. Hoyer attended the EAC meeting on Monday August 9th. They have finalized the evaluation forms and have made a recommendation for Rod and Gun Club. The Board has been provided copies for their review. Mr. Hoyer wanted to table approvals until the next meeting to give the Board time to review.

Subdivision & Land Development

<u>Keystone Foods Phase I Land Development – Resolution #LNT-24-21</u> – Lou Rauch, Lehigh Engineering, gave a presentation for the proposed land development. Also in attendance was Harley Shupp from CMG Construction Management.

Mr. Kortze reviewed his August 4th letter. Applicant has requested a waiver SALDO sections 401 and 501. Mr. Kortze had no issue with the requested waivers and recommended land development approval.

A motion was moved by Mr. Hoyer and was seconded by Mr. Boucher to approve waivers and Resolution #LNT-24-21. The motion carried unanimously.

Solicitor's Report

Solicitor Asteak reported that the Board held an executive session to discuss real estate matters. He asked for authorization for the Township Manager, Solicitor, and Engineer to commence negotiations with property owners to acquire the properties to improve the Newburg Intersection. A motion was moved by Mr. Hoyer and was seconded by Mr. Boucher to authorize negotiations.

Travis Gerould asked for an update to the demolition of the Newburg Inn. Mr. Pennington said we have a contract for demolition and the permit has been issued. Mr. Kortze once the asbestos remediation is complete demolition can begin.

Engineer's Report

Mr. Kortze reported the agreements for the Surrey Glen Walking Trail have been executed. He will be issuing the notice to proceed, and work should commence in early September.

Manager's Report

Acknowledge ASA Application – Ms. Stauffer reported that the Township received an Agriculture Security Application for 14 acres, 10 acres lie in Lower Nazareth and the other 4 in Upper Nazareth. Since Upper Nazareth does not have an ag sec area, Lower Nazareth will consider adding all 14 acres. The property is located at 3477 Daniels Road. A motion was moved by Mr. Hoyer and was seconded by Mr. Brown to acknowledge the receipt of application. The motion carried unanimously.

Solicitor Asteak noted this item will be on Upper Nazareth's agenda for approval to allow Lower Nazareth to include the 4 acre piece into their ag security area.

Ms. Stauffer noted that we have an Ag Security Committee, however since the last application two members have passed away: Supervisor liaison Bob Kucsan and Township resident/farmer Willard Setzer. Ms. Stauffer will run an advertisement for farmer replacement. The Board will need to appoint a Supervisor. A motion was moved by Mr. Boucher and was seconded by Mr. Brown to appoint Bob Hoyer to the Ag Security Committee. The motion carried. Ms. Stauffer will contact the other three members to ensure interest in serving on the committee.

<u>Certificates of Deposit – Resolution #LNT-25-21</u> – Ms. Stauffer reported that the certificates of deposit for our traffic impact and open space funds is maturing. She recommended reinvesting the traffic impact funds but liquidating the open space certificate for the continued development of Township parks. The amount to reinvest, as well as the amount to liquidate is \$525,268.18. A motion was moved by Mr. Brown and was seconded by Mr. Boucher to approve Resolution #LNT-25-21. The motion carried unanimously.

<u>2022 Mack Dump – Authorize Payment to EM Kutz</u> – Ms. Stauffer reported that the 2022 Mack has been delivered. Last meeting the Board authorized payment of cab and chassis. We are now in receipt of the invoice from E.M. Kutz for the body work. The cost is \$65.754.00. A motion was moved by Mr. Boucher and was seconded by Mr. Hoyer to approve payment to E.M. Kutz. The motion carried unanimously.

Payment of the Bills

A motion was moved by Mr. Boucher and was seconded by Mr. Brown to approve payment of the bills dated August 11th. The motion carried unanimously.
