LOWER NAZARETH TOWNSHIP BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MINUTES June 8, 2022

The Lower Nazareth Township Board of Supervisors held a hybrid meeting on Wednesday, June 8, 2022, Chairman James Pennington called the meeting to order at 7:03 PM.

Present were:

Agenda Amendment and Approval

Mr. Brown made a motion to amend the agenda to add "Notaro Property" under Solicitor's Report and "Jaindl Project Request" under Engineering Report. Mr. Boucher seconded. Motion passed.

Approval of Minutes

The meeting minutes of May 25, 2022, were submitted for review and approval. Mr. Boucher made a motion to approve the minutes as presented. Ms. Templeton seconded. Motion passed. Mr. Pennington abstained.

Reports

The financial report for April 2022 was presented.

Supervisor's Comments

<u>Multi-Municipal Comprehensive Plan</u> – Mr. Pennington reported a final draft copy has been distributed to all members of the Board. Mr. Pennington also reported he met with Chief DePalma regarding school safety and he is pleased to report that Colonial Regional is actively working with the school.

Open Space Preservation – Supervisor Hoyer reported on the EAC will be reviewing Property Proposal #3 at their meeting on June 13th.

<u>Parks & Recreation</u> – Supervisor Templeton reported Township received one bid for the wooden overlook at Hahn's Meadow Park. Carroll Engineering reviewed the bid and recommended the Board reject the bid as excessive. Mr. Hoyer made a motion to reject the bid from Bi-State Construction as excessive and to authorize the project to be rebid. Mr. Brown seconded. Motion passed.

The work at Surrey Glen Park is commencing on both the trail and playground.

Work at Newburg Park is continuing, and it is the hope of the Recreation Committee to have a grand opening for the park sometime in September or October.

Mr. Brown reported he attended the Nazareth Borough Memorial Day Parade and Hecktown Volunteer Fire Company looked very sharp.

Subdivision and Land Development

Solicitor's Report

Notaro Property – Attorney Asteak presented the Board with two resolutions that accept the necessary deed of dedication from Angelina Notaro, individually, and Notaro Family Trust. Mr. Hoyer made a motion to adopt the resolutions and to authorize the Chairman to execute them. Mr. Boucher seconded. Motion passed.

Mr. Hoyer made a motion to authorize the issuance of a check from the Lower Nazareth Township Traffic Impact Fund in the amount of \$761,104.27 for the Notaro real estate matter. Ms. Templeton seconded. Motion passed.

Ms. Templeton made a motion to authorize the Township Manager to execute all documents at closing on behalf of Lower Nazareth Township. Mr. Brown seconded. Motion passed.

Engineer's Report

Alternate SEO – Correspondence was received from Chris Noll requesting the Board to consider appointing Mr. Ian Stoudt as the Alternate Sewage Enforcement Officer. Mr. Brown made a motion to appoint Ian Stoudt as the Township's alternate sewage enforcement officer. Mr. Boucher seconded. Motion passed.

<u>Jaindl Project Request</u> – Mr. Kortze explained the request as put forth by Mr. Jaindl's engineer. The request involves the Township taking ownership of a pipe in contrast to PennDOT assuming ownership. Mr. Kortze explained while the Township would most likely do a better job of maintaining the pipe, it is one more thing for public works to maintain. After discussion, the Board concluded that PennDOT should maintain ownership of the pipe.

Mr. Kortze reported he has been in contact with representatives of Trammel Crow and J.G. Petrucci on the Hanoverville Road project. While the Board has expressed desire to have the developers perform full-depth reclamation on the road up to the bridge; however, there is an existing pipe that is creating an issue. The pipe is at a shallow depth and Mr. Kortze is recommending that area of the road should be mill and overlay.

Manager's Report

<u>Time Extension Report</u> – A report was provided to the Board of Supervisors notating the time extensions that have been granted since the previous meeting.

Lower Nazareth Rod & Gun Club — The Board previously authorized the solicitor and manager to negotiate the purchase of development rights for the property located on Georgetown Road and owned by Lower Nazareth Rod & Gun Club. A meeting was held with the property owner on June 2nd and the property owner's representatives have notified the Township that the offer has been accepted. Mr. Hoyer made a motion to acknowledge the acceptance of the Township's offer for development rights acquisition and to authorize the Township Engineer to prepare the necessary survey and legal description and to authorize the solicitor to prepare the necessary conservation easement documents. Ms. Templeton seconded. Motion passed.

<u>Hanover Township – Membership Request to Join Nazareth COG</u> – The Nazareth COG received correspondence from Hanover Township requesting membership. The general forum has voted on the request and unanimously approved membership for Hanover Township. The next step in the Articles of Agreement is for each municipal Board or Council to vote on the membership. Mr. Brown made a motion to approve the membership request from Hanover Township to become a member of the Nazareth Area Council of Governments. Mr. Boucher seconded. Motion passed.

Payment of the Bills

Mr. Boucher made a motion to pay the invoices as presented. Mr. Hoyer seconded. Motion passed.

Adjournment - The meeting adjourned at 7:34 PM.
