# LOWER NAZARETH TOWNSHIP BOARD OF SUPERVISORS **MINUTES**

February 22, 2023

The Lower Nazareth Township Board of Supervisors held a hybrid meeting on Wednesday, February 22, 2023, Chairman James Pennington called the meeting to order at 7:05 PM.

## Agenda Amendment and Approval

Ms. Stauffer requested to add playground repairs under Parks and Recreation. Mr. Brown made a motion to approve the amended agenda. Mr. Boucher seconded. Motion passed.

## **Approval of Minutes**

The meeting minutes of February 8, 2023 were submitted for review and approval. Mr. Hover made a motion to approve the minutes as presented. Mr. Brown seconded. Motion passed.

#### Reports

The Hecktown Fire Incident Report for January was presented.

#### **Supervisor's Comments**

Open Space Preservation - Mr. Hoyer reported that the EAC met on Monday. They forward a landscape plan to the Recreation Committee for review. They would like to plant trees on the western side of Newburg Park to complement the wooded area. Mr. Hoyer added that they will be having a cleanup at Surrey Glen Park, like last year, on Earth Day, April 22<sup>nd</sup>. More information will be provided, and fliers will be circulated. They are requesting up to \$750 for the event. Ms. Stauffer noted that this request was received after cutoff for the agenda and, unless the Board wishes to discuss this evening, the matter will be placed on the agenda for March 8<sup>th</sup>.

Parks & Recreation - Ms. Templeton provided updates on Township Parks and Events planned.

## Newburg Park:

- Security cameras have been installed and are functioning,
- The lighting project will begin installation on Monday, February 27<sup>th</sup>.
- The Township has received approval from DCNR for the splash pad purchase only. The cost of the splash pad from Vortex is \$501,000 and will be added to the March 8th agenda for a motion to purchase. Mr. Pennington inquired about grant funds. Ms. Stauffer stated

- we were awarded \$320,000. As the other components of the splash pad complex are approved, the Board will need to authorize those purchases.
- Mr. Kortze reported that work on the bathroom remediation project is scheduled to begin mid-March.
- Pickle Ball Courts A payment request has been received from the contractor in the
  amount of \$26,436.10. It has been reviewed and recommended for payment by Carroll
  Engineering. Mr. Hoyer made a motion to authorize payment release. Mr. Boucher
  seconded. Motion passed. We do not have a concrete time frame from the contractor for
  when work will commence and be completed.

#### Surrey Glen Park:

• Engineering is underway and an estimate of the total cost of the walking trail is forthcoming.

#### Butztown Road Park:

• Playground Repairs – Mr. Brown made a motion to for the repairs up to \$14,000. Mr. seconded. Motion passed.

## Community Events:

- The Easter Egg Hunt is coming along nicely. Donations are coming in from local businesses; however, donations are not as much as last year. Despite the decrease in donations, the Recreation Committee feels this event will be spectacular.
- Dog's Day Out We already have numerous vendors and food trucks signed up for the event.
- Halloween Trick-or-Treat will be on October 31<sup>st</sup> from 6:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. The Township will participate again in the annual Nazareth Halloween parade and will be handing out treats to the kids during trick-or-treat.
- Christmas Tree Lighting We will be hosting a tree lighting at Newburg Park on Friday, December 1<sup>st</sup>. Santa and the Grinch will be on hand for pictures. The Lower Nazareth Elementary School Chorus will be joining the festivities with holiday music.

The Recreation Committee is also proud to partner with the Hecktown Volunteer Fire Company and the Colonial Regional Police Department at all Township community events!

Nazareth Area Baseball Softball Association (NABSA) Field Expansion Proposal:
A request was made to place an additional backstop near one of the existing fields at 306
Butztown Park. The Recreation Committee reviewed the request and supports the request. Mr.
Brown noted that the Recreation Committee prefers the back corner for the backstop. Mr. Brown made a motion to approve the request of NABSA for the addition of a backstop at the Butztown Road Park per the recommendation of the Recreation Committee. Mr. Boucher seconded.
Motion passed.

#### Nazareth Library:

• Jeff Shepherd recently accepted reappointment as a representative to the Library Board however he would like to resign once a replacement can be found. Mr. Pennington asked

the Township Secretary to include an article in the Spring Newsletter to provide information on this position.

Mr. Boucher had no comments.

Mr. Brown reminded everyone that the Egg Hunt will be at 11am and noted that we are trying to make it more orderly this year. He also thanked the Lower Nazareth Elementary School Chorus for agreeing to participate in our Christmas Tree Lighting.

## Subdivision and Land Development

Northampton Farms LLC Land Development – Official Map – Ms. Stauffer reported that on February 7<sup>th</sup> a submission received. This property is on the Township's Official Map marked for development rights acquisition.

Mr. Brown made a motion to direct the Township Solicitor to correspond with the property owner and applicant to notify them of the property's status on the Township's Official Map and the Board's desire to invoke the Township's rights under the Official Map, to authorize the Township Manager to forward the matter to the EAC for recommendation, and to further authorize the Township Manager to obtain an appraisal of the development rights of the property. Mr. Hoyer seconded. Motion passed.

<u>Fence Waiver – Mach – 4379 Saratoga Drive</u> – Stephen Mach was present to explain his proposal. Mr. Boucher made a motion to grant the waiver. Mr. Brown seconded. Motion passed.

There was no report.

#### **Engineer's Report**

Mr. Kortze reported that the Newburg Road demolition projects were advertised on Penn Bid today. The bid opening will be March 16<sup>th</sup>.

Mr. Kortze also noted that the NPDES Permit for Newburg Park will be expiring in November 2023 and, since it is a lengthy process, he will be starting the process to renew permit soon.

#### Manager's Report
